April	Welcome & overview about the “Electoral Literacy Club” Introduction of the important people involved in conducting elections in India.	Briefly explain the objectives of the club To educate students on the electoral process, including the structure of the electoral system, the roles of different institutions, voting procedures, and the significance of informed voting. June	Voter Registration Drives Create a Political Party	To organize a mock voter registration drives for students. This activity emphasizes the importance of civic responsibility and participation in the democratic process. Learn about political ideologies and manifestos Steps: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In groups, students create their own political party. They decide on a name, logo, slogan, and 5-point manifesto. Present it to the class. The class votes on the most convincing party. Create a logo for each political party.
July	Electoral Quiz Role Play: Election Commission in Action	Objective: Understand the role of the Election Commission Steps: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assign roles: Chief Election Commissioner, polling officers, candidates, voters. Simulate setting up polling booths, enforcing the model code of conduct, and announcing results. Discuss responsibilities of each role afterward.
August	Debate: Should Voting Be Made Compulsory? Poster-Making: Importance of Voting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Objective: Develop reasoning and public speaking skills Steps: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Divide class into two teams (for and against). Allow preparation time and conduct the debate. Encourage students to use real-life examples and current events. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Objective: Encourage creativity and awareness Materials: Chart paper, sketch pens, colors Steps:

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask students to create posters on the importance of voting. - Display posters around the class or school bulletin board.

October	Voter Awareness Campaign	Objective: Promote electoral literacy Steps: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students create slogans, jingles, or skits on voter awareness. Perform them for the class or in a school assembly.
November	Mock Elections- A) Campaigning Voting	Simulate the electoral process through mock elections, allowing students to experience the stages of campaigning, voting, and counting. This hands-on activity fosters understanding of democratic practices.
December	Quiz Guest Lectures and Interactions	Invite election officials, political representatives, or subject-matter experts to speak to students about their experiences, the importance of free and fair elections, and democratic governance.
